__3. Discuss, consider and take action to select eligible projects for water/sewer corporations, and if funding remains, for road/bridge improvements, under the GLO CDBG-MIT-MOD.

Jill Phinney with Langford Community Management Services and James Weishuhn with Weishuhn Engineering were present to discuss the findings after visiting with the five water districts. He explained he had sent out interview questionnaires to the five water supply districts and had great response. He asked about the need for generators, their voltage, their phase, and motor size. These measurements were used to determine a preliminary size for each generator. It was determined that Barten Water District had raised money and purchased their own generator, but they need water supplies. Commissioner Gertson asked if grounding is included in the proposed cost. Mr. Weishuhn said grounding and lightning protection is included as well as a 1,000 gallon above ground propane tank for each generator. The generators will have an auto cycle (timing to be determined) to start up each one to ensure it is working properly. The generators will be on standby and only come on when power is out, and they are needed. It was discussed that it is imperative that the generator equipment includes a maintenance agreement. Judge Prause asked Ms. Phinney if the court went with the generators how much money would be left over for other projects. It was determined that \$800,000 - \$900,000 thousand would be left. Ms. Phinney went over the additional funds that were proposed to repair failing infrastructure in each district. Using these additional funds would utilize the entire \$1.7 million leaving nothing for roads and bridges. Judge Prause stated he feels we have come too far with the water districts, and he feels the entire amount should be used on the water districts. Commissioner Gertson and Commissioner Neuendorff agreed. Commissioner Kubesch asked how the funds were divided between the districts. James Weishuhn stated Weishuhn Engineering looked at what each water district needed and determined the break down. The court discussed ways to evenly divide the money between the districts. Mr. Weishuhn stated that Barten Water Supply only needed the \$200,000 that if they were given more money, they would have to search for ways to use it. He feels that Sheridan and Garwood water districts have the largest needs. Fire protection was brought up and it was discussed that the Rock

Island and Sheridan area did not have enough PSI to fill hydrants.

Motion by Judge Prause to allow approximately \$885,000 to purchase generators for

Garwood Water Supply District, Rock Island Water Supply District, Sheridan Water Supply

District, and Glidden Freshwater Supply District with the remaining funds to be divided with

Barten Water Supply receiving \$200,000 and the four remaining districts receiving \$320,000

-\$380,000 each to go towards their needed projects; seconded by Commissioner Gertson;

4 ayes 0 nays; motion carried; it was so ordered.
