


- WHEREAS,** Turtle Wing Foundation was founded in 2011 by DeeAnn Hooper in memory of her son Jackson Allan Hooper who passed away on April 5, 2011 of a viral-like syndrome of unknown origin. Jackson was diagnosed with high functioning autism at the age of six and due to various academic and social skill supplemental services was able to find success as an elementary student. Inspired by his life, Turtle Wing received its 501c3 status on September 12, 2012.
- WHEREAS,** the mission of Turtle Wing Foundation is to help individuals with learning challenges in rural areas achieve their full potential by providing access to a shared network of emotional, educational, and therapeutic resources. Turtle Wing programming strives to help children "grow wings and fly."
- WHEREAS,** the service area of Turtle Wing Foundation is Fayette, Lavaca, Colorado and surrounding counties with over 350 children presently receiving direct services due to Turtle Wing programming. Key programming areas for Turtle Wing includes Early Intervention, Supplemental Services and Community Education & Advocacy.
- WHEREAS,** April is Autism Acceptance Month. Autism is a general term used to describe a group of complex developmental brain disorders – autism spectrum disorders – caused by a combination of genes and environmental influences. These disorders are characterized, in varying degrees, by communication difficulties, social and behavioral challenges, and repetitive behaviors. An estimated 1 in 31 children in the U.S. is on the autism spectrum.
- WHEREAS,** over a quarter century ago, the Autism Society launched a nationwide effort to promote autism awareness, inclusion and self-determination for all, and assure that each person with ASD is provided the opportunity to achieve the highest possible quality of life.
- WHEREAS,** this year we want to go beyond simply promoting autism acceptance to encouraging friends and collaborators to become partners in movement toward acceptance and appreciation; to embrace a new perspective to ensure acceptance and inclusion in schools and communities that result in true appreciation of the unique aspects of all people; and to get one step closer to a society where those with ASDs are truly valued for their unique talents and gifts.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ty Prause, Judge of Colorado County, Texas, do hereby proclaim the month of April 2026

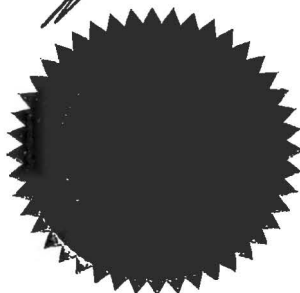
AUTISM ACCEPTANCE MONTH

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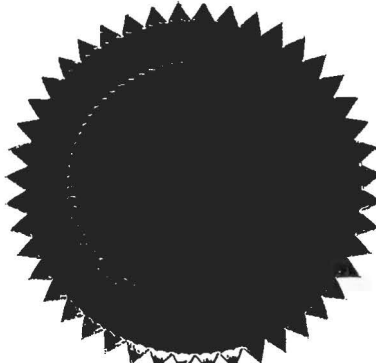
PROCLAMATION

TEXAS ARBOR DAY

- WHEREAS:** The first Arbor Day was April 10, 1872, when one million trees were planted by Nebraskans sparking nationwide days of annual planting, nurturing, and celebrating of trees known as Arbor Day, *and*
- WHEREAS:** By 1920, 45 states had adopted an annual Arbor Day. In 1972, at the 100th anniversary of the first Arbor Day, President Richard Nixon proclaimed the last Friday of April to be National Arbor Day. In Texas, Arbor Day first occurred in Temple on February 22, 1889. Today, Texas Arbor Day is recognized statewide on the first Friday in November, *and*
- WHEREAS:** Arbor Day is an event of promise looking forward to a future filled with trees and the wildlife they sustain. Arbor Day celebrates planting and nurturing trees and numerous ways trees enrich our lives and stabilize our environment, *and*
- WHEREAS:** Trees can improve air quality, reduce erosion, provide shade, and provide habitat for wildlife, beautify our community, *and*
- WHEREAS:** Trees, wherever planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal, *and*
- WHEREAS:** The Columbus Garden Club, a member of the Texas Garden Clubs, Inc. and National Garden Clubs, Inc., that works to beautify the community and promote planting of native trees and plants, shall plant a southern magnolia on the corner of the Courthouse next to the horse troughs. The planting commemorates the dedication and selfless service of Linda Counts to the Columbus Garden Club.
- NOW THEREFORE:** Be it proclaimed that to acknowledge the importance of trees and of citizens' service to others, the County of Colorado designates as Texas Arbor Day honoring Linda Counts, a great day of celebration on Wednesday, March 11, 2026.

Tax Abatement Guidelines and Criteria

The purpose of this document is to reauthorize, clarify or re-establish previously adopted guidelines and criteria for purposes of adopting a uniform policy of tax abatement, and to establish a competitive economic environment to attract commercial investment to Colorado County. The use of tax abatement as a tool to encourage a competitive commercial policy will serve to foster a long-term positive environment for economic development within Colorado County.

In order to be eligible for the designation of a reinvestment zone and receive tax abatement for improvements within that reinvestment zone, the planned improvement:

1. Must be reasonably expected to have an increase in positive net economic benefit to Colorado County of at least Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) over the life of the abatement, computed to include (but not limited to) new sustaining payroll and/or capital improvement. By "net" economic benefit, it is intended to reflect the benefit realized on the Colorado County ad valorem tax base less any costs incurred by Colorado County to facilitate the applicant's proposed improvement, such as road infrastructure, use of right-of-way, or other similar costs. The creation of new jobs will also factor in the decision to grant an abatement. The application should identify the number and type of temporary and new jobs, along with temporary and permanent annual payrolls, as well as average annual salary for each category of employee; and
2. Must not be expected to solely or primarily have the effect of merely transferring employment from one area of Colorado County to another.

In addition to the criteria set forth above, the Colorado County Commissioners Court reserves the right to negotiate a tax abatement agreement in order to compete favorably with other communities for the applicant's improvements.

Only projects that increase the fair market value of the property directly resultant from the development, redevelopment, and improvement specified in the contract will be eligible for abatement and then only to the extent that such increase exceeds any reduction in the fair market value of the other property of the applicant located within the affected jurisdiction creating the reinvestment zone.

All Abatement contracts will be for a term no longer than allowed by law.

It is the goal of Colorado County to utilize tax abatements on terms and conditions beneficial to the economic interests of the residents of Colorado County, to attract capital investment in Colorado County and to serve the beneficial interests of other affected jurisdictions having taxing authority within the proposed reinvestment zone. However, nothing herein shall limit the

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discretion of the Colorado County Commissioners Court to consider, adopt, modify or decline any tax abatement request.

These guidelines and criteria become effective on the date subscribed below, and shall at all times be kept current with regard to the needs of Colorado County and reflective of the official views of the Colorado County Commissioners Court. Therefore, in accordance with state law, and to facilitate this section, the Commissioners Court shall review and reauthorize, modify or amend these policies and guidelines every two years.

The adoption of these guidelines and criteria by the Colorado County Commissioners Court does not:

1. Limit the discretion of the Colorado County Commissioners Court body to decide whether or not to enter into a specific tax abatement agreement;
2. Limit the discretion of the Colorado County Commissioners Court to delegate to its employees the authority to determine whether or not the Colorado County Commissioners Court should consider a particular application or request for tax abatement;
3. The mere filing of an application in conformity with these criteria and guidelines does not vest or create any property interest, contract, or other legal right in any person filing such an application to have the Colorado County Commissioners Court grant any such application or request for tax abatement. The Colorado County Commissioners Court expressly reserves all rights vested by law to consider, approve, or decline such application for any reason within the sole discretion of the Commissioners Court.

**Section 1
Definitions**

“Abatement” means the full or partial exemption from ad valorem taxes of a certain portion of the appraised value of property in a reinvestment zone designated by Colorado County for economic development purposes.

“Affected jurisdiction” means Colorado County and any taxing authority having jurisdiction over land located within the proposed reinvestment zone and also located within Colorado County that levies ad valorem taxes upon and provides services to property located within the proposed or existing reinvestment zone designated by Colorado County.

“Agreement” means a contractual agreement for tax abatement between a property owner and/or lessee and Colorado County.

“Applicant” means any person, including business entities, who file an application in conformity with these guidelines seeking tax abatement from Colorado County, Texas.

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“Base year value” means the assessed value on the eligible property as of January 1 preceding the execution of the agreement, plus any agreed upon value of eligible property improvements made after January 1, but before the execution of the Agreement.

“Eligible facilities” means new, expanded, or modernized buildings and structures, including fixed machinery and equipment, which is reasonably likely as a result of granting abatement to contribute to the retention or expansion of primary employment or to attract major investment in the reinvestment zone that would be a benefit to the property and that would contribute to the economic development of Colorado County, but does not include deferred maintenance of existing facilities. Hotels are not excluded from this definition of eligible facilities.

“Expansion” means the addition of building structures, machinery, equipment, or payroll for purposes of increasing production capacity.

“Facility” means property improvement completed or in process of construction which when complete will comprise an interconnected whole capable of increasing the ad valorem property value of the land or leasehold estate and providing employment within the county, and further means products, buildings and structures, including machinery and equipment, the primary purpose of which is or will be the manufacture of tangible goods or materials or the processing of such goods or materials by physical or chemical change, including the generation of electrical energy or digital information or computer based information.

“Ineligible facilities” means existing facilities which are intended to primarily provide goods or services to residents for existing businesses located in Colorado County, such as, but not limited to, restaurants and retail sales establishments.

“Modernization” means a complete or partial demolition of facilities and the complete or partial reconstruction or installation of a facility of similar or expanded production capacity. Modernization may result from the construction, alteration, or installation of buildings, structures, machinery, or equipment, or both.

“New facility” means property previously undeveloped which is placed into service by means other than or in conjunction with expansion or modernization.

“Other basic industry” means buildings and structures including fixed machinery and equipment not elsewhere described, used or to be used for the production of products or services, which serve a market primarily outside of Colorado County, resulting in the creation of new permanent jobs bringing in new wealth.

“Facility owner” means the owner of the facility constructed within a reinvestment zone, if not the property owner.

“Property owner” means the title owner to real property subject to any tax abatement agreement, or a Lessee of the owner responsible for leasehold improvements to the real property.

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“Productive life” means the number of years a property improvement is expected to be in service as a functioning and operational facility. The term includes useful life or economic life of a facility.

**Section 2
Abatement Authorized for Development Goals**

A. Eligible Facilities. Upon application, eligible facilities as defined herein may be considered for tax abatement as hereinafter provided.

B. Creation of New Values. Abatement may only be granted for the additional value of eligible property improvements made subsequent to and as specified in an abatement agreement between Colorado County and the property owner or applicant, including a lessee, subject to such limitations as Colorado County may require at its sole discretion.

C. New and Existing Facilities. Abatement may be granted for the additional value of eligible property improvements made subsequent to and specified in an abatement agreement between Colorado County and the property owner or lessee, subject to such limitations as Colorado County may require at its sole discretion.

D. Eligible Property. Abatement may be extended to the value of buildings, structures, fixed machinery and equipment, site improvements and related fixed improvements necessary to the operation and administration of the facility.

E. Ineligible Property. The following types of property shall be fully taxable and ineligible for tax abatement: land, supplies, tools, furnishings, and other forms of movable personal property, housing, deferred maintenance, property to be rented or leased except as provided in Section 2, property which has a productive life of less than ten years, but does not include spare parts associated with eligible facilities; property owned or used by the State of Texas or its political subdivisions or by any organization owned, operated or directed by a political subdivision of the State of Texas; or any other property for which abatement is not allowed by state law.

F. Owned/Leased Facilities. If a leased facility is permitted by state law to be granted abatement, the abatement agreement shall be applicable to the taxable value of the leased improvement, and where appropriate, may be executed with both the lessor and the lessee, but where the landowner has executed a lease with the leaseholder, the lessee alone may seek tax abatement on the value of its leasehold interest in the improvements to the realty.

G. Economic Qualifications. In order to be eligible for designation as a reinvestment zone and receive tax abatement, the planned improvement:

1. Must be reasonably expected to have an increase in positive net economic benefit to Colorado County of at least Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) over the life of the abatement, computed to include (but not limited to) new sustaining payroll and /or capital improvement; and

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2. Must not be expected to solely or primarily have the effect of merely transferring employment from one area of Colorado County to another.
3. The applicant must demonstrate sufficient experience in the industry relevant to the application, and sufficient financial capacity to perform the project as proposed.

H. Standards for Tax Abatement/Development Goals. The following factors, among others as may be determined to be relevant by the Colorado County Commissioners Court, may be considered in determining whether to grant tax abatement, but this list is illustrative and not exclusive of the matters the Colorado County Commissioners Court may consider:

1. Value of existing improvements, if any;
2. Type and value of proposed improvements;
3. Productive life of proposed improvements;
4. Number of existing jobs to be retained by proposed improvements;
5. Number and type of new jobs to be created by proposed improvements;
6. Amount of local payroll to be created;
7. Whether the new jobs to be created will be filled by persons residing or projected to reside within affected jurisdiction;
8. Must be reasonably expected to have an increase in positive net economic benefit to Colorado County of at least Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000.00) over the life of the abatement, computed to include (but not limited to) new sustaining payroll and /or capital improvement;
9. The costs to be incurred by Colorado County to provide infrastructure directly resulting from the proposed new improvements;
10. The amount of ad valorem taxes to be paid to Colorado County during the abatement period considering:
 - a. the existing values;
 - b. the percentage of new value to be abated;
 - c. the difference between current tax revenues being paid upon the relevant property and under the proposed abatement agreement.
 - d. the length of the abatement period; and

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e. the anticipated depreciated remaining taxable value of the improvements after expiration of the abatement period.

11. The population growth of Colorado County that occurs directly as a result of new improvements;

12. The types and values of public improvements, if any, to be made by applicant seeking abatement;

13. Whether the proposed improvements compete with existing businesses to the detriment of the local economy or employment levels;

14. The impact on the business opportunities of existing businesses;

15. The potential for attraction of other new businesses to the area;

16. The overall compatibility with the existing zoning ordinances or regulations and comprehensive economic planning for the area;

17. Whether the project has provisions intended to protect the general health, safety and welfare of Colorado County residents who may be impacted by the project, specifically whether the planned improvements include setbacks, visual screening, noise level limitations or other accommodations which might be reasonably expected of similar projects; and

18. Whether the project obtains all necessary permits from the applicable environmental agencies. Satisfactory evidence of compliance with any applicable state or federal regulations will be required.

Each eligible facility shall be reviewed on its merits utilizing the factors provided above. After such review, abatement may be denied entirely or may be granted to the extent deemed appropriate after full evaluation.

I. Construction in Progress. If a qualifying facility has not been placed in service within two-year after execution of the abatement agreement, the applicant may apply for a one-year extension of the term of abatement, to be granted or denied in accordance with the agreement. Said extension must be applied for prior to the expiration of the one-year anniversary of execution of the abatement agreement.

J. Denial of Abatement. Neither a reinvestment zone nor abatement agreement shall be authorized if it is determined that:

1. There would be substantial adverse effect on the provision of government services or tax base;

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2. The applicant has insufficient financial capacity to perform the obligations of an abatement agreement;
3. Planned or potential use of the property would constitute a hazard to public health, safety or morals;
4. Violation of other codes or laws; or
5. Any other reason deemed appropriate by the Colorado County Commissioners Court.

K. Taxability. From the execution of the abatement to the end of the agreement period, taxes shall be payable as follows:

1. The value of ineligible property as provided in Section 2 E shall be fully taxable; and
2. The base year value of existing eligible property as determined by the Chief Appraiser on January 1 of each year shall be determined, and the terms of the abatement agreement, if any, will determine to what extent such property values will be taxable and at what rate during the term of any abatement agreement.

The residual, depreciated value of eligible property shall be fully taxable at the end of the abatement period.

**Section 3
Application**

A. Any present or potential owner of taxable property in Colorado County may request the creation of a reinvestment zone and tax abatement by filing a written application with the County Judge.

B. The application shall consist of a written request for tax abatement, accompanied by:

1. An analysis of the net economic impact such an abatement will have on Colorado County, including:
 - a. Estimated tax revenues annually for the term of the requested abatement, taking into account any requested abatement.
 - b. A comparison between an abatement of taxes and any requested "payment in lieu of taxes" (PILOT) in terms of benefit to Colorado County over the proposed term of the abatement period.
 - c. A declaration of the depreciation method to be applied to the investment and a statement of the expected residual taxable value of the proposed project at the end

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of the abatement term requested, and the remaining taxable life expectancy of the proposed project.

d. A declaration that remediation of the property to its former state has been anticipated, and that such remediation will not result in the imposition of recovery costs upon the County or underlying landowners where the project is based upon a leasehold interest. To the extent practicable, the provisions of Sections 301 and 302 of the Texas Utilities Code will be followed regarding remediation of the property at the end of the project's useful life.

In the event of partial or substantial destruction of improvements due to acts of God or Force Majeure, the owner is responsible for the gathering and clean-up of damaged materials in an expeditious manner, and to properly dispose of any such materials at an approved waste disposal/recovery facility.

2. A general description of the proposed use and the general nature and extent of the modernization, expansion or new improvements to be undertaken;
3. A descriptive list and approximate taxable value of the improvements which will be a part of the facility;
4. A property description, including a legal description of the property, which may be satisfied by a list of the property parcel identification number used by the Colorado County Appraisal District, the title owner to the parcel so identified, and the acreage within each parcel so identified;
5. A map of the proposed reinvestment zone, showing a detailed map of the reinvestment zone, including any county or state-maintained roads providing access to the land to be improved within the reinvestment zone, together with an inset map of where, within Colorado County, the proposed reinvestment zone is located. Any affected jurisdictions with taxing authority over land included in the proposed reinvestment zone should be identified as well. The map should be presented in PDF and JPG formats, suitable for publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the county. The use of color should not interfere with the legibility of the map;
6. A time schedule for undertaking and completing the planned improvements. In the case of modernization, a statement of the assessed value of the facility, separately stated for real and personal property, shall be given for the tax year immediately preceding the application. The application form may require such financial and other information as the County deems appropriate for evaluating the financial capacity and other factors of the applicant;
7. Certification from the Colorado County Appraisal District verifying that no taxes are past due on applicant's property located in the proposed reinvestment zone;
8. Disclosure of any environmental permits required or additional environmental impacts;

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9. A \$1,000.00 non-refundable application fee, payable to Colorado county, and delivered with the signed application in the office of the County Judge.

In the case of modernization, a statement of the assessed value of the current facility, separately stated for real and personal property, shall be given for the tax year immediately preceding the application. The County may require such financial and other information as deemed appropriate for evaluating the financial capacity and other factors pertaining to the applicant, to be attached to the application.

C. All checks in payment of the administrative fee shall be made payable to Colorado County. In addition to the application fee, which shall be applied to any fee charged by legal or financial analysis of the application, the applicant shall also agree to pay reasonable consulting and attorney fees as may be incurred by Colorado County in the examination of the application as well as the preparation and negotiation of any tax abatement agreement. Such fee reimbursement shall not exceed \$10,000.00.

D. Colorado County shall give notice as provided by the Property Tax Code, i.e. written notice, to the presiding officer of the governing body of each taxing unit in which property to be included within the proposed reinvestment zone and subject of the tax abatement agreement is located not later than the seventh (7th) day before the public hearing and publication in a newspaper of general circulation within such taxing affected jurisdiction not later than the thirtieth (30th) day before the public hearing. Before acting upon the application, Colorado County shall, through public hearing, afford the applicant, the designated representative of any governing body referenced hereinabove, and members of the public the opportunity to appear and provide testimony why the abatement should or should not be granted.

E. If a city within Colorado County designates a reinvestment zone within its corporate limits and enters into or proposes to enter into an abatement agreement with a present or potential owner of taxable property, such present or potential owner of taxable property may request tax abatement by Colorado County, and shall follow the same application process described in Section 3, et seq, hereof. No other notice or hearing shall be required except compliance with the Open Meetings Act, unless the Commissioners Court deems them necessary in a particular case.

F. Variance. Although a variance is not favored, exceptional circumstances may support a request for variance from the provisions of Section 2, in which case such request for a variance may be made in an application or other written form to the Commissioners Court. Such request shall include all the items listed in Section 3 B and may include a complete description of the circumstances which prompt the applicant to request a variance. The approval process for a variance request shall be identical to that for a standard application and may be supplemented by such additional requirements as may be deemed necessary by the Commissioners Court. To the full extent permitted by applicable law, the Commissioners Court shall have the authority to enter into an abatement agreement with terms and conditions that vary from the terms and conditions in these Guidelines, but only so long as the Commissioners Court determines that such variances are in the best interests of Colorado County. Any terms or conditions contained in an abatement

agreement approved by the Commissioners Court that vary from the terms and conditions in these Guidelines shall automatically be deemed to have been granted an approved variance by the Commissioners Court, shall be binding and enforceable as agreed to in the abatement agreement, and shall control in the event of any inconsistency or conflict with these Guidelines. A variance granted to any applicant shall not be deemed a variance for any subsequent applicant.

G. Confidentiality Required. Information that is provided to the County in connection with an application or request for tax abatement and that describes the specific processes or business activities to be conducted or the equipment or other property to be located on the property for which tax abatement is sought may be deemed as confidential and not subject to public disclosure only if specifically identified by the applicant, and segregated from the remaining portions of the application. Once the Tax Abatement Agreement is executed, all attachments to the abatement agreement shall become public. All information in the custody of a taxing unit after the agreement is executed is Public Record, and not confidential.

**Section 4
Agreement**

A. The Colorado County Commissioners Court of Colorado County, after review, shall approve or deny an application for tax abatement, and if granted, shall execute an agreement with the applicant or owner of the facility and/or leasehold interest, which shall:

1. Include a list of the kind, number, and location of all proposed improvements to the property and if this is not defined at the time of the agreement, then to be supplemented after construction of the facilities;

2. Provide for reasonable access to and authorize inspection of the property by the affected jurisdiction to ensure compliance with the agreement;

3. Limit the use of the property consistent with the affected jurisdiction's developmental goals as stated in Section 2 of the Colorado County Tax Abatement Guidelines and Criteria;

4. Provide for recapturing property tax revenues that are lost if the applicant/owner fails to make improvements as provided by the agreement;

5. Include a summary of each term agreed upon with the property owner and require the applicant/owner of the facility to annually certify compliance with the terms of the agreement to each taxing unit and any leasehold agreement with landowners; and

6. Allow the affected jurisdiction to cancel the agreement after notice of default and opportunity to cure if the applicant or owner fails to comply with the terms of the agreement.

B. The owner of the facility and/or lessee shall also agree to the following:

1. A specified number of permanent full-time jobs at facility shall be created, and the owner and lessee shall make reasonable efforts to employ persons who are

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residents of Colorado County in such jobs provided, however, that there shall be no obligation to employ residents who are not:

- a. equally or more qualified than nonresident applicants;
- b. available for employment on terms and / or salaries comparable to those required by nonresident applicants; or
- c. able to become qualified with 72 hours training provided by owner.

2. Each person employed in such job shall perform a portion, if not all, of their work in Colorado County.

C. Applicant shall agree that it and its contractors, if any, will use reasonably commercial efforts to maximize its use of goods and services available through Colorado County businesses in the construction, operation, and maintenance of the improvements and the project; provided, however, that there shall be no requirement to use goods and services provided by Colorado County residents that are not:

1. of similar quality to those provided by nonresidents; or
2. made available on terms and conditions (including pricing) comparable to those offered by nonresidents. Comparable price shall be defined as less than or equal to 105% of the nonresident price for equivalent quality, conditions and terms.

D. Applicant or its construction contractor, if any, shall designate a coordinator of local services who will act as liaison between any individuals, businesses, and contractors residing or doing business in Colorado County who are interested in obtaining information about providing goods or services related to the construction of the project.

E. Additionally, applicant or its construction contractor, if any, shall advertise in local newspapers in Colorado County for local contractors to perform work on the construction of the project.

F. Applicant shall agree to maintain a viable presence (as below defined) within the reinvestment zone for a period of time, as set by the Colorado County Commissioners Court, not to exceed twenty (20) years from the date that the abatement agreement first takes effect. For purposes hereof, "Maintain a Viable Presence" means (i) the operation of the eligible facilities, as the same may from time to time be expanded, upgraded, improved, modified, changed, remodeled, repaired, restored, reconstructed, reconfigured and/or re-engineered, and (ii) the retention of not fewer than the number of qualifying jobs as defined by Texas Tax Code Section 313.021(3)(E) to be located and performed, in part, within Colorado County.

G. On May 1st of each year that the agreement shall be in effect, applicant shall certify to the County Judge of Colorado County, and to the governing body of each taxing unit within the

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proposed reinvestment zone, that applicant is in compliance with each applicable term set forth above.

H. Such agreement shall normally be executed within sixty (60) days after the applicant has forwarded all necessary information and documentation to the Commissioners Court.

**Section 5
Recapture**

A. In the event that the company or individual:

1. Allows its ad valorem taxes owed Colorado County to become delinquent and fails to timely and properly follow the legal procedures for their protest and/or contest; or
2. Violates any of the terms and conditions of the abatement agreement and fails to cure during the cure period.

The agreement then may be terminated and all taxes previously abated by virtue of the agreement will be recaptured and paid within thirty (30) days of the termination.

B. Should the Colorado County Commissioners Court determine, in its sole discretion, that the company or individual is in default according to the terms and conditions of its agreement, Colorado County shall notify the company or individual in writing at the address stated in the agreement, and if such is not cured within thirty (30) days from the date of such notice (cure period) then the agreement may be terminated.

C. In the event that the applicant's facility is completed and begins producing products or services, but subsequently discontinues producing a product or service for any reason for a period of one year during the abatement period, other than because of fire, explosion, or other casualty, accident, or natural disaster, then the agreement shall terminate and so shall the abatement of the taxes for the calendar year during which the applicant's facility no longer produces. The taxes otherwise abated for that calendar year shall be paid to the County within sixty (60) days from the date of termination.

**Section 6
Administration**

A. The Chief Appraiser of the Colorado County Appraisal District will annually determine an assessment of the real and personal property comprising the reinvestment zone. Each year, the company or individual receiving abatement shall furnish the Appraiser with such information as may be necessary for the abatement. Once value has been established, the Chief Appraiser will notify the Commissioners Court of Colorado County of the amount of the assessment.

B. The agreement shall stipulate that employees and/or designated representatives of Colorado County will have access to the applicant's facilities within the reinvestment zone during

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the term of the abatement to inspect the facility to determine if the terms and conditions of the agreement are being met. All inspections will be made only after the giving of reasonable notice and will only be conducted in a manner as to not unreasonably interfere with the construction and/or operation of the facility. All inspections will be made with one or more representatives of the applicant, and in accordance with its safety standards.

C. Upon completion of construction, the designated representative of Colorado County shall annually evaluate each facility receiving abatement to ensure compliance with the agreement. The improvements shall be maintained in good repair, with any damaged assets repaired or replaced in a timely manner. A formal report shall be made to the Commissioners Court.

D. Timely Filing. Colorado County shall timely file, with the appropriate person, agency, department, or board of the State of Texas, all information required by the Tax Code.

**Section 7
Assignment**

A. Abatement may be transferred and assigned by the holder to a new owner or lessee of the same facility only upon the written approval of the Commissioners Court of Colorado County. Such approval is subject to the financial capacity of the assignee and provided that all conditions and obligations in the abatement agreement are guaranteed by the execution of a new contractual abatement agreement with Colorado County. No assignment or transfer shall be approved if the parties to the existing agreement, the new owner or new lessee, are liable to any affected jurisdiction for outstanding taxes or other obligations.

B. An assignment shall not serve to extend the termination date of the abatement Agreement with the original applicant, owner or lessee. An assignment may not alter venue provisions of the original agreement.

C. Approval of an assignment in conformity with this section shall not be unreasonably withheld.

**Section 8
Venue**

Any abatement agreement shall be conditioned upon venue for any disputes which may arise under the abatement agreement to be retained in courts of appropriate jurisdiction within Colorado County, Texas, or appeals to Texas courts of appellate jurisdiction, or the United States District Court having jurisdiction in Colorado County, Texas.

**Section 9
Sunset Provision**

These guidelines and criteria are effective upon the date of their adoption and will remain in force for two years unless amended by three quarters vote of the Commissioners Court of

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Colorado County, at which time all reinvestment zones and tax abatement agreements created pursuant to these provisions will be reviewed to determine whether the goals have been achieved. Based on the review, the guidelines and criteria will be modified, renewed, or eliminated.



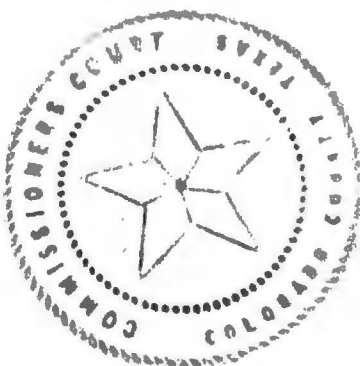

WHEREAS, the Colorado County Commissioners Court desires to amend and continue its Tax Abatement Guidelines and Criteria; and


WHEREAS, the Colorado County Commissioners Court elects to continue to be eligible to participate in tax abatement.

- _11. Request by Colorado County EMS for a dedicated credit card only to be used by crews on deployment. (Furrh/Ingvarsdson)

Michael Furrh stated EMS is in need of a dedicated credit card for deployments. Colorado County participates in a statewide initiative called Emergency Medical Passports where crews can be called upon at any time for state emergencies. The items charged on the credit card would all be reimbursable expenses. EMS currently has two credit cards with limits of \$1,500 to \$2,000. These cards are not dedicated to deployments so the cards may not have the full amount available at the time of deployment. Mr. Furrh added that having a dedicated card would make filling out the paperwork for reimbursement easier. Commissioner Brandt asked about waiting until the bank transition was complete before proceeding with the dedicated card. Michael Furrh replied that waiting was possible, however, deployments can happen at any time. Commissioner Gertson and Judge Prause asked about increasing the credit limit on the card and Michelle Lowrance stated that the bank will have a whole new credit card process when Huntington Bank takes over in June and she is not sure how that system will work. She informed the court that the credit card system is not tied to deposits. Mr. Furrh suggested a \$10,000 credit limit. Michelle Lowrance said there are categories that can be blocked on the credit card to prevent fraud. Judge Prause asked EMS to meet with Joyce Guthmann to discuss what categories would need to be included to prevent the card being denied.

Motion by Judge Prause to have Michael Furrh and/or Marti Ingvarsdson meet with the County Treasurer to discuss categories to be considered when using the card and bring those findings back to the court for approval; seconded by Commissioner Gertson; 5 ayes 0 nays; motion carried; it was so ordered.

Affordable Care Act Reporting and Tracking Service (ARTS) Renewal Information

The Texas Association of Counties Health and Employee Benefits Pool (TAC HEBP) has begun the renewal process for those counties and districts participating in the Affordable Care Act Reporting and Tracking Service (ARTS). Renewal will enable your entity to produce the forms required by IRS Sections 6055/6056 for calendar year 2026, assuming this reporting continues to be a requirement. Reporting will consist of Form 1095C in electronic format, which must be made available to employees and filed with the IRS (plus transmittal Form 1094C, filed with IRS). Current law requires all employers with 50 or more full-time equivalent employees to file these forms. ARTS will provide measurement period tracking for 2026 and beyond (to determine whether an employee must be offered health coverage), as well as affordability testing for groups that require employee contributions toward the cost of their own health coverage.

As your county or district provides health benefits through TAC HEBP, ARTS will continue to be available at NO COST in 2026, assuming program deadlines are met.

Your entity will need to continue sending employee, payroll, and unpaid leave of absence files to TAC HEBP in order to utilize this service for the 2026 reports. **Payroll data must be provided for each payroll cycle. Employee files must be provided, at a minimum, once per quarter. LOA files may be provided if and when applicable.** The information provided will be used to determine:

- 1) whether individuals are eligible for a federal premium subsidy or tax credit; and
- 2) whether your entity is subject to penalties under the ACA employer mandate.

Some payroll vendors have worked with TAC to produce these files for you. You will be responsible for the completion of required information in your payroll system and submission to TAC, but this eliminates the need for manually producing additional spreadsheets.

If you use a payroll system that will produce the required IRS forms, and you determine that your entity does not need measurement period tracking or affordability monitoring, you may not need ARTS. It is a service offered by TAC and is completely optional.

- **The top row MUST BE the column headers only**

File Types

There are three separate files your group should provide to TAC for participation in the ARTS program: *Employee Information, Payroll Detail, and Leave of Absence*, if applicable. TAC has provided a template for each of these three files. Please note that file specifications can change due to modifications in Affordable Care Act legislation and / or enhancements or updates to the ARTS program.

File Format

The templates provided by TAC are in Excel 97-2003 format. If your version of Excel is newer, there should not be any compatibility issues. If you are providing the files directly from your payroll software, the file format should be CSV (comma-separated variable). CSV is the preferred format.

When to send files

Employee Information: Send an initial file containing every county employee who was on your payroll as of the first of the year. You can send an updated file after every payroll cycle, but must send an updated file **AT LEAST** once per quarter.

Payroll Detail: Send after every payroll cycle, beginning with your first payroll period of the year.

Leave of Absence: Send **only** if the leave is for FMLA, Jury Duty, Military Duty or Worker's Comp **AND** the employee is projected to be on LOA for four weeks or more.

File Names

The standardized naming convention for ARTS files is: **County_Name_filetype_filedate**. File types are "EEFile", "PRFile", and "LOAFile". The date should be entered in YYYYMMDD format.

Example: For Your County's Employee Information file containing all employees as of January 1, 2023, the file name would be "*Your_County_EEfile_20230101*" e.g. *Bee_County_EEfile_20230101*.

The Your County Payroll Detail file with a pay date of January 11, 2023, would be named: "*Your_County_PRFile_20230111*" e.g. *Bee_County_PRfile_20230111*.

The Your County Leave of Absence file with a pay date of January 11, 2023 would be labeled: "*Your_County_LOAFile_20230111*" e.g. *Bee_County_LOAfile_20230111*.

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Please note that file specifications can change due to modifications in Affordable Care Act legislation and/or enhancements or other changes to the ARTS program.

Should you have more than one of the same type file for the same paydate/file date, include an A, B, C, etc. to designate an additional file.

Example: Your County employees with monthly pay frequency are paid on January 11, 2023 and employees with biweekly pay frequency are also paid on January 11, 2023. The monthly employees' payroll file would be named "Your_County_PRfile_A_20230111" e.g. Bee_County_PRfile_20230111. The biweekly pay frequency employees' payroll file would be named "Your_County_PRfile_B_20230111" e.g. Bee_County_PRfile_B_20230111. The employee file for January 11, 2023 can be one file with all employees listed or you can provide two separate files for the respective groups, distinguished with the A, B, C, etc.

Where to send files

Your files will be uploaded to TAC using *Syncplicity*. The information in your *Syncplicity* folder is secure. The folder resides at TAC behind our firewall; your information is secure once it is placed in the *Syncplicity* folder. Contact us at ARTS@county.org to receive instructions on how to set up and use *Syncplicity*. Then upload files to your online *Syncplicity* account in the folder named: **0000 ARTS Files**. **NOTE: TAC does not use the desktop version of *Syncplicity* so please do not download this software to your desktop – use the web version at Syncplicity.com.**

SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS FOR EACH FILE TYPE

File 1: Employee Information (EEFile)

The Employee Information file contains basic employee information about every *county* employee* on your payroll. Your initial Employee Information file should contain all county employees as of the first of the current calendar year. Only include retirees that retire after the first of the year and are covered on your medical plan. Subsequent files will be sent along with the Payroll Detail file after every payroll cycle (or at least once per quarter). When creating these files after the first time, TAC suggests you open the most recent version of the file and save it as a new file, changing the date to correspond with the payroll period ending date. In the newly saved file, you will make any changes that occurred since the last payroll, such as new hires, terminations, pay rate changes, etc.

***Note: Do not include records for non-county employees, such as Adult Probation or Agrilife Extension personnel, who are state or A&M employees and receive their health benefits from them.**

Column Descriptions

All fields are required, except for *MiddleName*, *HomeAddressLine1, *HomeAddressCity**, *HomeAddressState**, *HomeAddressZIP**, and *NotificationEmail*.**

** these fields are required for Reporting Services Only (RSO) groups*

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FEIN – enter Federal Employment Identification Number. You will only need to enter this on the first line, it will automatically insert this value for the rest of your records. Do not include a hyphen. For example: If your FEIN is 74-1234567, enter 741234567.

SSN – enter employee's 9-digit social security number. Do not include hyphens. We have the template set up to insert the hyphens for you.**

CurrentStatus -- choose the appropriate current status from the drop down list. The options are A = Active, G = Terminated, I = Inactive and R = Retired.

OriginalHireDate -- enter the original hire date in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes.
Example: April 15, 2023 will be entered as 04/15/2023.

MostRecentHireDate --enter the most recent hire date in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes.
Example: April 15, 2023 will be entered as 04/15/2023. This date may be the same as or later than the Original Hire Date.

MostRecentStartDate -- enter the most recent hire date in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes.
Example: April 15, 2023 will be entered as 04/15/2023. This date may be the same as or later than the Most Recent Hire Date.

TerminationDate – enter this date if applicable. Enter termination date in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes. Example: April 15, 2023 will be entered as 04/15/2023. Leave this field blank if it is not applicable (do NOT enter 00/00/0000).

FirstName – enter employee's first name.

LastName – enter employee's last name.

MiddleName – enter employee's middle name or initial. This is not a required field.

PayRate – This is the rate of pay at the time of this pay cycle and is related to the Pay Type. Do not include any currency symbols or commas. Example: Enter 10.50 if employee is paid \$10.50 an hour (Pay Type = HY). Enter 1500.00 if employee is paid \$1,500.00 biweekly (Pay Type = TW).

PayType – This relates to the Pay Rate (i.e. \$10.50 per hour, \$1250 every two weeks, etc.) Choose the appropriate option from the drop down list. The options are HY = per hour, TW = every 2 weeks, HM= per half month, MY = per month, WY = per week, DY = per day, YY = per year and SH = per shift.

PayCycleFrequency – The frequency of your payroll cycles. Choose the appropriate option from the drop down list. The options are BW = BiWeekly, SM = SemiMonthly, MY = Monthly and WY = Weekly.

HomeAddressLine1 – enter the employee's full address. If the employee has an apartment, duplex, unit number etc., include on this line. Do not include punctuation. Example: Enter 123 St Louis Ave Apt 4A if employee's home address is 123 St. Louis Ave., Apt 4A. Physical address is preferred. This is not a required field*.

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HomeAddressCity -- enter the employee's address city. Do not include punctuation. Example: enter St Louis if employee's home address city is St. Louis. This is not a required field*.

HomeAddressState -- enter 2-letter abbreviation for employee's address state (i.e. TX for Texas). This is not a required field*.

HomeAddressZIP -- enter employee's zip code. You may add the +4 zip code extension however, you should not use a hyphen. Example: enter 787682131 if employee's zip+4 is 78768-2131. This is not a required field*.

NotificationEmail -- enter the employee's email address. This is not a required field.

DateOfBirth -- enter the employee's birthdate in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes. Example: April 15, 2023 will be entered as 04/15/2023. You may enter 00/00/0000, if DOB is not known.

ACAEmployeeDesignationCode -- Choose the appropriate employee designation code from the drop down list. The options are FT= Full Time, PT = Part Time, S = Seasonal and V = Variable.

ACAPayTypeClassificationCode -- Choose the appropriate employee designation code from the drop down list. The options are H = hourly or S = Salaried.

JobTitle -- enter the specific job title for employee. This is limited to 45 characters. If you do not have a specific job title for an employee, or employee has terminated and you typically remove that title from their file, you may enter "none".

***Reporting Services Only (RSO)** Groups will be required to provide this information in the Employee File. All other groups will have the information taken from OASys. To ensure the most up to date information is pulled, make sure to update OASys as soon as a change is made.

******The templates are designed for the information to be keyed into it. If you cut and paste from a different source, the fields may not work as designed. Thus, if you cut and paste the SSN from a source that does not have the hyphens included and do not choose the option to "match destination formatting" via Paste Special, the hyphens will not show. This is not a critical error. It is an aesthetic choice.

If you use V lookups on your spreadsheet, remember to Copy and Paste Values for that column once the data is populated.

Once files are received and processed, you will receive an email or phone call if anything failed so that you can update and resubmit.

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File 2: Payroll Details (PRFile)

The Payroll Details file contains basic pay information about every *county employee** on your payroll, including part-time, variable hour, and seasonal employees. Your initial Payroll Detail file should contain all county employees as of the first pay period that ended during January, 2023. Subsequent files will be sent along with the Employee Information file after every payroll cycle. When creating these files after the first time, TAC suggests you open the most recent version of the file and save it as a new file, changing the date to correspond with the payroll period ending date. In the newly saved file, you will make any changes that occurred since the last payroll, such as changes to hours worked, changes to gross pay amounts, pay rate changes etc.

***Note: Do not include records for non-county employees, such as Adult Probation or Agrilife personnel, who are State or A&M employees and receive their health benefits from them.**

When multiple pay rates are applied, please provide the **base pay rate** and do not adjust or average based on overtime or different pay rate.

If adjustments to a prior pay period are being submitted, regardless of the pay date or when the data is sent, it is critical to properly set the pay period start and end dates to associate the hours with the correct dates.

Please note that file specifications can change due to modifications in Affordable Care Act legislation and / or enhancements or other changes to the ARTS program.

Column Descriptions

All fields are required, except FirstName & LastName.

PayDate – enter the pay date in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes. Example: April 15, 2023 will be entered as 04/15/2023. You will only need to enter this on the first line, it will automatically insert this date for the rest of your records.

PayPeriodStartDate -- enter the pay date in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes. Example: April 15, 2023 will be entered as 04/15/2023. **This date must be earlier than the PayDate.** The template will prompt you if the Pay Period Start Date is later than the Pay Date. You will only need to enter this on the first line, it will automatically insert this date for the rest of your records.

PayPeriodEndDate -- enter the pay date in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes. Example: April 15, 2023 will be entered as 04/15/2023. **This date must be later than the Pay Period Start Date.** The template will prompt you if the Pay Period End Date is earlier than the Pay Period Start Date. You will only need to enter this on the first line, it will automatically insert this date for the rest of your records.

FEIN – enter Federal Employment Identification Number. You will only need to enter this on the first line, it will automatically insert this value for the rest of your records. Do not include a hyphen. For example: If your FEIN is 74-1234567, enter 741234567.

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SSN – enter employee's 9-digit social security number. Do not include hyphens. We have the template set up to insert the hyphens for you.*

FirstName – this is an optional field added due to our members' feedback. We will ignore this column on the payroll report. Thus, you may enter first name. This is not a required field.

LastName – this is an optional field added due to our members' feedback. We will ignore this column on the payroll report. Thus, you may enter last name. This is not a required field.

PayRate – This is the rate of pay at the time of this pay cycle and is related to the Pay Type. Do not include any currency symbols or commas. Example: Enter 10.50 if employee is paid \$10.50 an hour (Pay Type = HY). Enter 1500.00 if employee is paid \$1,500.00 biweekly (Pay Type = TW).

PayType - This relates to the Pay Rate (i.e. \$10.50 per hour, \$1250 every two weeks, etc.). Choose the appropriate option from the drop down list. The options are HY = per hour, TW = every 2 weeks, MY = per month, WY = per week, DY = per day, YY = per year and SH = per shift.

PayCycleFrequency – The frequency of this payroll cycle. Choose the appropriate option from the drop down list. The options are BW = BiWeekly, SM = SemiMonthly, MY = Monthly and WY = Weekly. This is not a required field.

HoursWorked – Enter the number of hours employee is being paid for (worked, vacation, sick etc.) in this pay cycle. Do not multiply overtime hours. Enter the appropriate number of hours for your full-time salaried employees, such as 80.0 for a bi-weekly pay cycle or 40.0 for a weekly pay cycle.

GrossPay – Enter the employee's gross pay for this pay cycle. This includes the base pay plus any overtime, paid leave, etc. *before* any deductions. Do not include any currency symbols or commas. Example: Enter 1000.50 if employee's gross pay is \$1,000.50 before deductions for this pay period. This is not a required field.

*The templates are designed for the information to be keyed into it. If you cut and paste from a different source, the fields may not work as designed. Thus, if you cut and paste the SSN from a source that does not have the hyphens included and do not choose the option to "match destination formatting" via Paste Special, the hyphens will not show. This is not a critical error. It is an aesthetic choice.

If you use V lookups on your spreadsheet, remember to Copy and Paste Values for that column once the data is populated.

Once files are received and processed, you will receive an email or phone call if anything failed so that you can update and resubmit.

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File 3: Unpaid Leave of Absence (LOAFile)

The Unpaid Leave of Absence file contains information about any county employee who is on **unpaid protected** leave of absence during a particular payroll cycle. ONLY provide this file if the leave is for FMLA, Jury Duty, Military Duty or Worker's Comp AND the employee is projected to be on LOA for four weeks or more.

Include all unpaid, protected leaves that are not represented with compensation or hours worked in the payroll detail file. For example, if an employee had one day of jury service, but the payroll reflected that she was paid full rate that day, do NOT include the employee here. If the employee had 2 months of Family Medical leave, and was compensated only by a third-party provider, or not compensated, DO include the information here.

Column Descriptions

All fields are required, except FirstName, LastName, LOAEndDate and LOAHours.

FEIN – enter Federal Employment Identification Number. You will only need to enter this on the first line, it will automatically insert this value for the rest of your records. Do not include a hyphen. For example: If your FEIN is 74-1234567, enter 741234567.

SSN – enter employee's 9-digit social security number. Do not include hyphens. We have the template set up to insert the hyphens for you.*

FirstName – this is an optional field added due to our members' feedback. We will ignore this column on the LOA report. Thus, you may enter first name. This is not a required field.

LastName – this is an optional field added due to our members' feedback. We will ignore this column on the LOA report. Thus, you may enter last name. This is not a required field.

LOA Reason Code -- enter the reason for the unpaid leave of absence. Example: 'Family Medical Leave' or 'Military Leave'.

LOA Start Date-- enter the first date the employee is considered to be UNPAID, not the last day worked, in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes. Make sure you do not include any paid vacation time in the LOA Start Date calculation. Example: An employee takes vacation pay from April 1-14 then begins Unpaid LOA on April 15, 2023, the LOA Start Date will be entered as 04/15/2023.

LOA End Date – Not a required field - enter this date if applicable. You may provide a future date if the leave of absence days are known in advance. If the return date is not known, leave this field blank. Enter this date in MM/DD/YYYY format with slashes. Example: If the last day of unpaid leave is April 20, 2023, then enter 04/20/2023.

LOA Hours – Not a required field - enter the number of unpaid hours for **partial day leave only** (LOA Start and End Dates should be the same). This field will only be used for intermittent unpaid leave,

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such as when an employee on FMLA is out for a doctor's appointment and the hours missed are not compensated. This field will only allow up to 24 hours as this is truly for a partial day of leave.

Example situations:

- 1) Employee is on unpaid LOA beginning June 1 and returns June 14. You would enter the appropriate information in FEIN, Employee SSN and LOA Reason Code. LOA Start Date = 06/01/2023. LOA End Date = 06/14/2023. You would enter nothing in LOA Hours field.
- 2) Employee is on unpaid LOA beginning June 1 and you do not know return date. You would enter the appropriate information in FEIN, Employee SSN and LOA Reason Code. LOA Start Date = 06/01/2023. You would enter nothing in LOA End Date or LOA Hours fields.
- 3) Employee is on unpaid LOA for 4 hours on June 20. You would enter the appropriate information in FEIN, Employee SSN and LOA Reason Code. LOA Start Date = 06/20/2023. LOA End Date = 06/20/2023. LOA Hours = 4

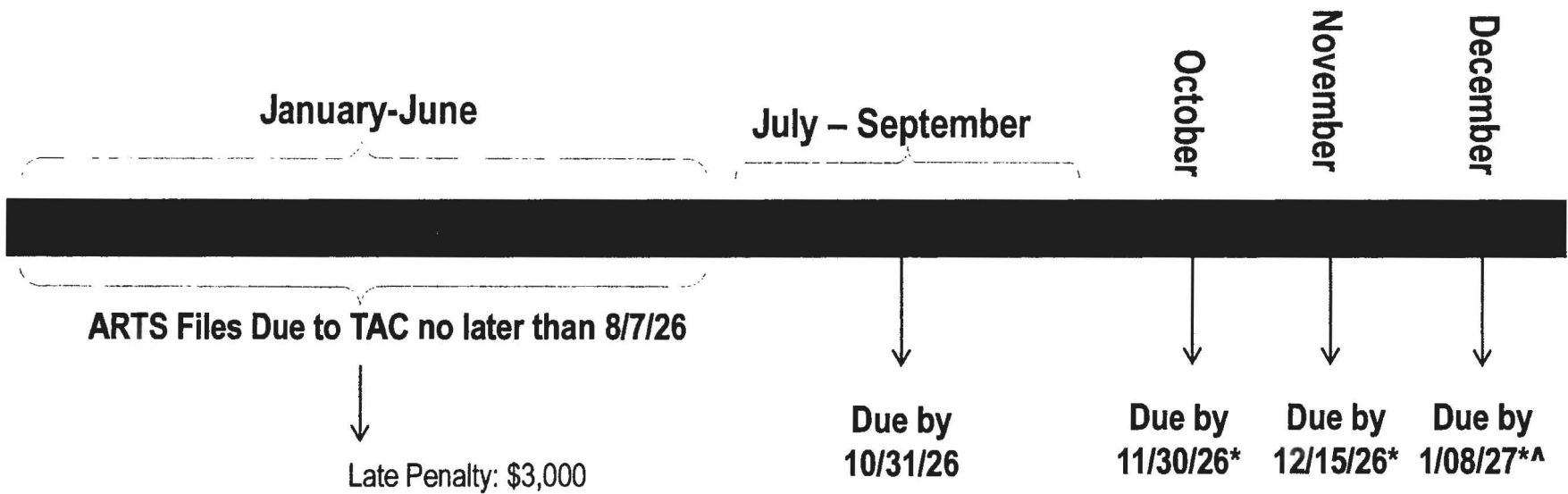
Once a person is on the LOA file, they will remain on the file for the remainder of the year.

NOTE: *It is critical that we receive the files in the proper format and the correct naming convention. Failure to do so may result in our inability to provide this service to your county or district.*

- 2) Group agrees to pay program fees as described in the **2026 ARTS Fee Schedule** on page 2.

Enrollment and Data Submission Deadlines

- Please refer to the enclosed "2026 Deadlines for ARTS Files" document for details.
- Groups who wish to participate in the ARTS program must return the signed documents to TAC HEBP no later than **March 31, 2026** in order to participate.
- Data file transmission to TAC HEBP must begin no later than **August 7, 2026**, to avoid late fees, however, **we recommend that you continue sending your files after each payroll or at least monthly** to avoid getting backlogged.



WHEREAS, Texas Local Government Code Section 352.081 provides that the Commissioners Court of a county, by order, may prohibit outdoor burning in the unincorporated area of a county if the Commissioners Court makes a finding that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated areas create a public safety hazard that would be made more severe by outdoor burning; and

WHEREAS, the Colorado County Commissioners Court finds that circumstances and conditions present in the unincorporated areas of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court that outdoor burning is restricted in the unincorporated areas of the county for 90 days from the date of this Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by this Court or the County Judge. This Order is adopted pursuant to local Government Code §352.081(c)(2), and other applicable statutes. This Order restricts outdoor burning as follows:

1. **Outdoor burning banned.** Unless an exception appears below, the use of combustible materials in an outdoor environment by any person is prohibited. Combustible materials include, but are not limited to burning of trash, brush and open campfires and materials used outdoors in activities that could result in a fire. A person may not sell, detonate, ignite, or in any way use fireworks classified as "skyrockets with sticks" under 49 C.F.R. part. 173.100(r)(2) (10-01-86 edition) or missiles with fins in any portion of the unincorporated areas of Colorado County.
2. **Exceptions.** The following outdoor activities shall be allowed provided they are attended at all times and all following precautionary rules and measures are strictly followed:
 - **Household Trash.** Burning of household trash in a receptacle that is enclosed and covered with a mesh material with no more than ¼ inch openings and supervised in a safe area clear of debris.
 - **Barbecues** using above-ground grills, with enclosed fireboxes, in a safe area clear of debris or other combustible materials and attended at all times.
 - **Controlled burns** necessary for planting and harvesting agricultural crops with a defensible space around the burn area, presence of fire suppression tools, and personal presence during the entire controlled burn.
 - **Authorized by TCEQ.** This order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for: (1) firefighting training; (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; (3) planting or harvesting of agriculture crops; or (4) burns that are conducted

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
by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048, Natural Resource Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resource Code.

- **Attwater Prairie Chicken Refuge** maintenance activities.
- **Non-Profit & Religious Organizations** shall be allowed to prepare barbecue provided they contact their local fire department in advance for a site visit by a member of the department and follow all precautionary measures directed by such department.
- **Outdoor Welding** shall only be allowed under the following circumstances:
 - (i) welding, cutting and grinding associated with welding activities shall not take place when the wind is over 15 miles per hour;
 - (ii) the welder must notify the Colorado County Sheriff's Department before any welding, cutting or grinding begins; all grass, leaves, brush and other easily combustible materials must be cleared with a twenty (20) foot radius surrounding the area where activity is to take place before any welding, cutting or grinding begins; and,
 - (iii) a spotter with water and a ready pressurized delivery system must be on hand before any welding, cutting or grinding begins and remain on hand until the activity is completed.

If the responding peace officer determines that a person responsible for the fire is in violation of this Order prohibiting outdoor burning, a citation will be issued.

In accordance with the Texas Local Government Code §352.081(h), a violation of this order is a Class C Misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of up to \$500.00.

In accordance with the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure, the Colorado County Sheriff's Office has compiled data for Racial Profiling obtained from our records management software for the reporting period of January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2025. During the reporting period, the Colorado County Sheriff's Office conducted a total of 4,447 traffic stops and received no complaints related to racial profiling. By comparing 2025's traffic stop data to previous years, I reviewed three years of records and found the following totals.

- 2024-1,539
- 2023- 1,611
- 2022-1,518

The Colorado County Sheriff's Office has had a Racial Profiling Policy since January 1, 2002. In 2025, a newly updated policy was implemented. This policy specifically prohibits racial profiling and provides a complaint process for anyone who believes they have been the victim of it.

- 1) clearly defines acts constituting racial profiling;
- 2) strictly prohibits peace officers employed by the COLORADO CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE from engaging in racial profiling;
- 3) implements a process by which an individual may file a complaint with the COLORADO CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE if the individual believes that a peace officer employed by the COLORADO CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE has engaged in racial profiling with respect to the individual;
- 4) provides public education relating to the agency's complaint process;
- 5) requires appropriate corrective action to be taken against a peace officer employed by the COLORADO CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE who, after an investigation, is shown to have engaged in racial profiling in violation of the COLORADO CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE policy;
- 6) requires collection of information relating to motor vehicle stops in which a warning or citation is issued and to arrests made as a result of those stops, including information relating to:
 - a. the race or ethnicity of the individual detained;
 - b. whether a search was conducted and, if so, whether the individual detained consented to the search;
 - c. whether the peace officer knew the race or ethnicity of the individual detained before detaining that individual;
 - d. whether the peace officer used physical force that resulted in bodily injury during the stop;
 - e. the location of the stop;
 - f. the reason for the stop.
- 7) requires the chief administrator of the agency, regardless of whether the administrator is elected, employed, or appointed, to submit an annual report of the information collected under Subdivision (6) to:
 - a. the Commission on Law Enforcement; and
 - b. the governing body of each county or municipality served by the agency, if the agency is an agency of a county, municipality, or other political subdivision of the state.

The COLORADO CO. SHERIFF'S OFFICE has satisfied the statutory data audit requirements as prescribed in Article 2.133(c), Code of Criminal Procedure during the reporting period.
